#### 3 Report from the Chair

State of the business and Future direction

Summary of what happened in 2013 and issues facing OHA

Thank you all for coming to the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Hazelnut Symposium.

First off I want to thank all the sponsors that helped make this gathering possible and I want to thank the founding sponsors who have been with us from the start.

They are: Ferrero, Grimo Nursery, Mori Nursery, OMAF, OCE, Erie Innovation,

OFVA, U of G, Earthgen, Brant Co., Norfolk Co.

I am sure we will all come away from this gathering with a better understanding of how the Hazelnut Industry is developing in Ontario.

This process has been ongoing for a minimum of six years and is very close to the next major step which is the planting out of the first orchards.

This last year saw many major steps taken in this development of the Hazelnut Industry in Ontario. Most of these will be mentioned later in the Report on Activities

The OHA is now a registered corporation.

We have, as of last count, around 200 growers committed to starting commercial orchards. Rob Haynes will take the list of any new memberships and growers.

The initial selection of hazelnut varieties have been determined.

The University of Guelph has been successfully developing the tissue culture protocols for each of these varieties.

A technology transfer agreement has been reach with Harsters to produce micro-propagated trees.

Mori Nurseries will work with Harsters to grow and distribute these trees to other nurseries.

Last but definitely not the least, OHA has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Ferrero to work together to develop the hazelnut industry in Ontario.

Ferrero ultimately is expected to be the largest single customer of Ontario grown hazelnuts.

**Everything is in place to start things rolling.** 

In order to do that the growers will need to take the final step and order the trees for their orchard.

The 200 growers we spoke of is just the first 10-15% of the number we anticipate we will need to reach the goal of 20,000 acres planted by 2030.

The OHA is calling out for more growers to commit to the planting of hazelnut orchards and for all those interested parties to become a member today.

We have proven that we can grow hazelnuts in Southern Ontario, EFB free, over the past 20 years.

Economic studies show that, once in production, hazelnuts are very profitable.

The demand for hazelnuts is increasing worldwide while the supply is not keeping up to this demand.

There is great potential here for the Ontario Hazelnuts

Going forward we need to get trees into the ground as soon as they are available. That will take a commitment from growers and nurseries.

Once the orchard planting starts on an annual basis we need to ensure that consolidators will be there at year 4-5 to handle the crop as it starts to come in.

There are a number of issues that will need to be addressed as this industry develops

Question about spraying of trees.

Replied that Todd Leuty was working on new sprays and would be discussed later in the symposium.

Questions on why Turkey's declining production.

Standard reply of poor harvesting practises, small rough/wild lots, declining interest to harvest crop.

Scott Deslippe in Essex would like to collaborate with local growers.

One attendee indicated that each community has a Community Futures organization that may help in the cost of these type collaborations.

#### 6 Report on OHA activities

and Things Important to OHA in 2013

Meeting with Ferrero in April

OHA was incorporated at the end of May, 2013

Doc. Signed by Premier of Ont. Kathleen Wynne

Min. of Agriculture and Rural Affairs

Sent out a call for Growers in June and came back with about 200 names of interested growers

Large meeting in June @ Ferrero following which the Memorandum of Understanding was drafted between

Ferrero and OHA.

Early summer tours of hazelnut plantings in Essex, Simcoe and Niagara. Representatives from Ferrero were present.

In Sept. OHA held three training sessions in Essex, Guelph and Simcoe with a total of about 120 attendees.

In early Oct. the MoU was signed at the Italian Embassy in Ottawa. John Kelly provide further details later in this meeting.

Meetings have been held with funding groups

Ag Canada, OMAF and Agri-Credit -

Planning for the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Symposium

Through the Rapid Response Fund we were able to send two board members to Chile to observe the state of the hazelnut industry there to see what we can learn from their experiences. Linda and Rob will talk about this later.

University of Guelph have continued along in the development of protocols for each variety of hazelnut of interest.

Distribution of the micro propagated trees

Harsters have entered into an agreement where they will provide cloned selections to Mori Greenhouses who will act as the central distributer for the trees to other nurseries and to the public.

There is a \$4.8 M AIP application currently under review under the Agi- Innovation and Federal Going Forward 2 programs. This is a key part in the development of the hazelnut industry in Ont. No news yet.

Dr. Elliot Currie has volunteered to act as the Executive Director for OHA for a year starting April.1, 2014

Efforts will be directed: to raising the profile of OHA
